Increasing Vaccination and Reducing Antimicrobial Use – *A/Prof Lim Poh Lian, TTSH & NCID*



A/Prof Lim is Head of Travellers' Health & Vaccination Clinic, and Senior Consultant at Tan Tock Seng Hospital and the National Centre for Infectious Diseases. She chairs the National Antimicrobial Resistance Control Committee, and has served on the Expert Committee on Immunisation (ECI) for over 10 years. She also founded the Pre-Discharge Vaccination programme at TTSH in 2010, which has raised vaccine uptake for influenza and pneumococcal vaccination in thousands of patients.

A/Prof Lim will share on the role of vaccination in reducing antimicrobial utilisation and resistance.
